COMMUNION SUNDAY:

Welcome to all who have come to worship the Lord our God!

We plan to celebrate Holy Communion during the afternoon worship service today.

If you are visiting, the elders want to draw your attention to the fact that the Lord's Supper is administered under the oversight of the elders who are required to uphold the Biblical standard. The Lord's Supper is for true believers who are united to Christ and his Church. If you desire to participate in communion with us, we ask you to affirm all the following questions:

1. **You have been baptized** into the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit (as an infant or as an adult)?
2. You have sincerely repented of your sins and made a **public profession of your trust in Christ alone to save you?**
3. You sincerely desire to live a Godly, Christian Life. **You are living a life of faith and repentance** and seek to walk in obedience to all of His commandments?
4. **You are presently a member in good standing of a protestant congregation that bears the marks of the Church?** You are accountable to your elders (Acts 20:28)? They know you (1 Peter 5:1-3; Heb 13:17)? You are actively participating in the worship and life of your church (Col. 3:15-16; Heb. 10:23-25)?

If you sincerely answer, "Yes," to all of these questions, then the elders welcome you to participate in Holy Communion with us. If you cannot answer, "Yes," we ask you to refrain, and

express our desire to speak with you about these matters.

COVER SYMBOL:

Central Oregon United Reformed Church sits in the valley beneath the Cascade Mountains. Above them is the glory cloud. This is the visible manifestation of God's holy presence among his people. It appeared over the tabernacle and temple (Ex. 40:34-35; 1 Kings 8:10-11) and at Christ's transfiguration (Matthew 17:5), signaling that God dwells with and reveals himself to his covenant people. It symbolizes God's presence reigning over and protecting his Church, reminding us that Christ rules his people and gathers them before his glory.

ELEMENT OF THE WEEK

Many churches observe a moment of silent reflection before worship to help transition from the distractions of daily life to a spiritually focused state—body, mind, and heart. The psalmist writes, "My tongue is the pen of a ready writer" (Psalm 45:1), and just as an ancient scribe prepared his reed before writing, we prepare ourselves for worship by turning our attention to God. Zechariah 2:13 calls, "Be silent, all flesh, before the LORD, for he has roused himself from his holy dwelling," while Zephaniah 1:7 urges, "Be silent before the Lord GOD! For the day of the LORD is near." Take this time to be in awe of his majesty, grace, and presence.
